Legislative Priorities

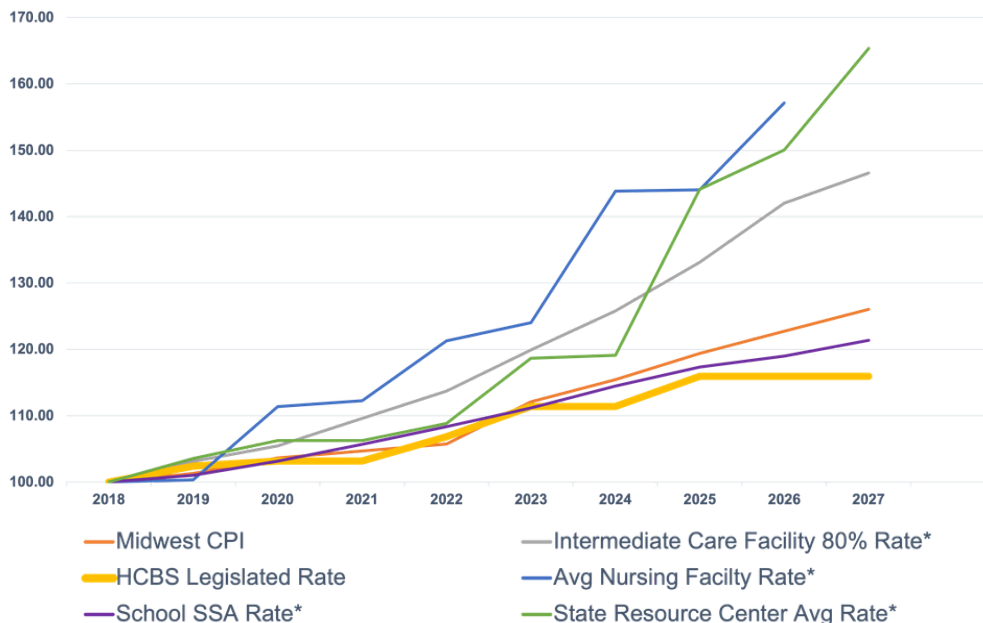
HCBS Priorities

- 3% Across-the-board rate investment to sustain quality services.
- Implement regular, scheduled rate reviews for HCBS and Habilitation, with a predictable process to ensure providers can meet capacity needs.

Mental Health Priorities

- Community Mental Health Prescriber rates and SNMIS safety net service rates must match Medicaid rates - same service, same rate.
- Direct 70% of Community Mental Health Center (CMHC) block grant funds straight to CMHC providers.

Policy Initiatives

- Require that providers receive at least 30 days' advance notice before Medicaid funding ends for any member, to address eligibility communication gaps and prevent unrecoverable costs.
- Recognize Relias as a state-supported learning management system. Providers utilize Relias for comprehensive libraries — supporting industry best practice, credentialing/certification to reduce administrative cost and streamline regulatory compliance.

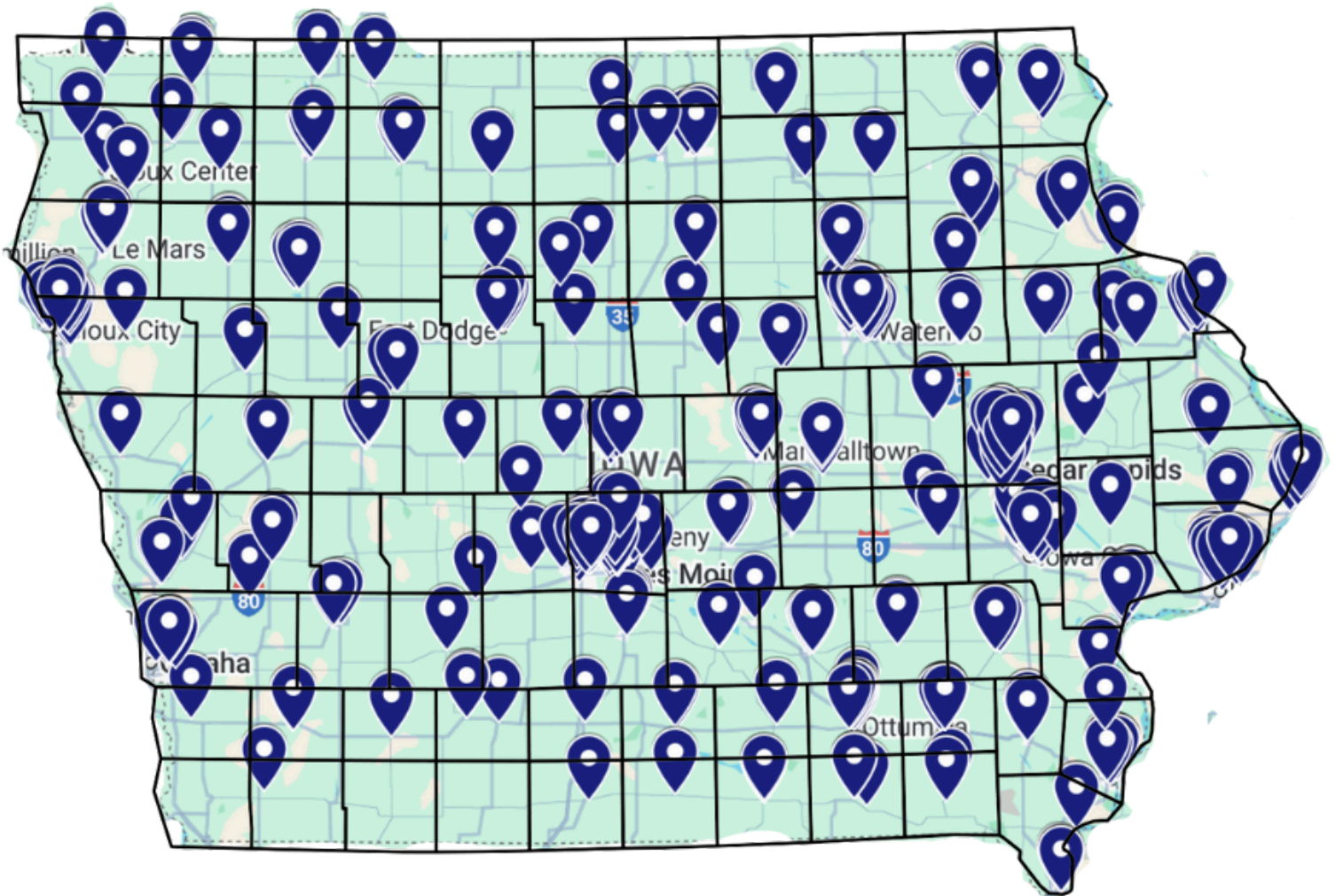
